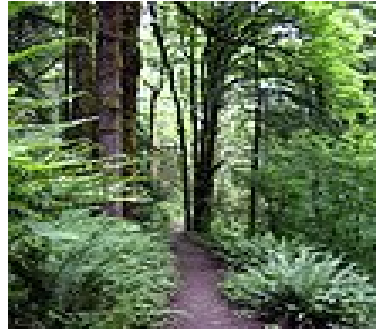


August 7 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 10: George Washington Campground

In 1965, Australian sailors stationed in Newport provided the manpower that created the Walkabout Trails. We will hike the scenic blue trail.

***We will meet on Rt 44 outside the campground entrance. Park on the dirt and grass OFF the shoulder of the road. The Gloucester Police allow parking here.**



August 14 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 11: Steere Hill Conservation Area

For our second visit to Steere Hill, we will walk the Field, Cutter, and Phillips Trails with a side trip to an unmarked cemetery.

***We will meet at the parking lot on Putnam Pike ACROSS from the Harmony Post Office.**



August 21 at 8:00 a.m

Walk 12: Pulaski Park

We will return to Pulaski Park, hike a section of the wooded orange trail, and then continue along a gravel road when we leave the woods. This walk will take about an hour and a half to complete.

***We will meet at the parking lot AT THE BEACH.**

August 28 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 13: We will vote either to return to a favorite group location or to explore a new trail. The final group decision will be posted to the library website by early August.

Most walks are about an hour or a little over an hour in duration except for Walk 12 and possibly Walk 13. Wear comfortable sturdy footwear because the trails feature rocks and tree roots. June 5 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 1: George Washington Campground

For our first walk of the 2024 season, we'll hike the Angel Loop, starting with beautiful views of Bowdish Lake and ending along the campground's hike-in tent sites.

***We will meet on Rt 44 outside the campground entrance. Park on the dirt and grass OFF the shoulder of the road. The Gloucester Police allow parking here.**



June 12 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 2: Wolf Hill Forest Preserve

Wolf Hill is a Smithfield Land Trust property offering several miles of beautiful trails, including the WWII Memorial Trail.

***We will meet at the trail head directly on Waterview Drive in Smithfield.**

June 19 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 3: Sprague Farm/Klutz Woodland

The Gloucester Land Trust has opened new trails at Sprague Farm. We will hike the Klutz Trail that features stone walls and a very large chimney.

***We will meet at the Dr. Klutz Memorial parking lot on Joe Sweet Road.**



June 26 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 4: Steere Hill Conservation Area

Steere Hill offers a couple hundred acres of gentle slopes, vernal pools, miles of stone walls, and scenic ledge vistas. For this first visit, we'll hike the Ridge and Stone Dam Trails.

***We will meet at the parking lot on Putnam Pike ACROSS from the Harmony Post Office**

July 3 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 5: Ponaganset High School Cross Country Trail

Used by the PHS Cross Country Team and host to the State Cross Country Championships, wide and well-groomed trails boast 3 bridges and one beautifully crafted covered bridge.

***We will meet at the parking lot next to the athletic fields (the lot furthest to the right at the high school complex).**

July 10 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 6: Sprague Farm

For this walk, we'll hike on the main trail, passing the remains of two farmsteads and continue on along the John Ridge Trail and Colonel Anthony Trail.

***We will meet at the parking lot on Pine Orchard Road.**

July 17 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 7: Pulaski Park

Wide and well-maintained trails offer a walk over a stream through a covered bridge and ending with views of lovely Peck Pond.

***We will meet at the parking lot AT THE BEACH.**



July 24 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 8: Heritage Park

Heritage Park offers 115 acres of trails crossing several streams and passing by a shepherd's hut. We'll climb Steere Hill and then head back along the Outer Loop Trail and cross a small wooden bridge.

*** We'll meet at the parking lot on Chestnut Oak Road**

July 31 at 8:00 a.m.

Walk 9: Wolf Hill Forest Preserve

For our second visit to this location, we'll explore a section of the red trail and revisit the WWII memorial.

***We will meet at the trail head directly on Waterview Drive in Smithfield.**
